Membership Responsibilities

- (a) to comply with the CATSI ACT and the Rule Book
- (b) to notify the Corporation of any change to my address within 28 days
- (c) to comply with any Code of Conduct adopted by the members
- (d) to treat other Members and the Directors with respect and dignity.
- (e) to not behave in a way that significantly interferes with the operation of the Land Group or of Land Group meetings or Land Committee Meetings

NGOONOORU LAND GROUP MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION AND FAQs

What is the benefit of being a Member?

In addition to other rights under the CATSI Act, a Land Group Member has the following rights:

- (i) to attend, speak and vote at a Land Group Meeting of the Corporation;
- (ii) subject to rule 28.2.1, to be elected or appointed as a Land Committee Member for a Land Group Area;
- (iii) to put forward resolutions to be voted on at a Land Group Meeting in accordance with rule 27.5;
- (iv) to ask the Land Committee to call a Land Group Meeting in accordance with rule 27.2.2;

A Land Group Member cannot be removed as a Land Group Member unless the Land Group and the Corporation have complied with rule 26.7.

How does my application get approved?

The Ngoonooru Land Committee is responsible for assessing and deciding all Membership Applications in accordance with section 26.1.3 of the Rule Book. Once your application has been received by Wajarri Yamaji Aboriginal Corporation it will be sent to the next Land Committee meeting for assessment. This can take up to 4 – 8 weeks depending on when the next meeting is being held.

How soon will I find out if my application has been approved?

If your application is approved, you will be notified by the Wajarri Yamaji Aboriginal Corporation within 14 days after the decision has been made. Your details will also be added to the Wajarri Yamaji Aboriginal Corporation Register of Land Group Members within 14 days.

What are the circumstances which my Membership Application may not be approved?

Applications may not be approved if the applicant does not meet the eligibility requirements under 26.1.2 of the Rule Book.

What if my application is not approved?

If your Membership Application is not approved, you will be notified of the reasons in writing by the Wajarri Yamaji Aboriginal Corporation. You are entitled to appeal this decision. You can do this by notifying the Wajarri Yamaji Aboriginal Corporation basis on which you appeal by sending an email to members@wajarri.com.au outlining why you appeal the decision. Your application will then be presented to the Land Committee for review for its consideration. If the Membership Application is again refused, then you can appeal again in which case your application is put to a resolution of the Ngoonooru Land Group at the next available opportunity.
